The Plan

- CRLS is planning to offer HN ELA 9 course for <u>all</u> 9th grade students starting in SY 2017-18.
- In SY 2018-19 CRLS is planning to offer HN World History 2 courses for <u>all</u> 9th grade students
- Both courses are semester based courses.
- No additional courses are being considered for "leveling up" at this time.

The Rationale-

Do students differ in talents and achievement? They do. But when those observed differences are reinforced by track placement and grouping practices, and children then internalize those differences, learning opportunities become limited for all but the elite student. The talents of late bloomers go undiscovered, and the rewards of hard work and diligent study are never realized.

From Detracking for Excellence and Equity CRLS started working with Carrol Burris in SY 15-16 on this initiative. Ms. Burris' books On the Same Track and Detracking for Excellence and Equity are important Discussing the rationale behind the proposal should begin with the following questions:

- At what grade level in CRLS are students first grouped for instruction?
- What is the rationale for starting to group students at that grade level?
- What influence does this grouping have on students' later instructional placement and educational opportunities?
